Payment:

The amount of the registration fee - **80€** has to be payed upto **18th April 2012** to the organiser office (Standquartier).

The national organisations has to give the donated prizes, with the national anthem in the organiser office, simultaneously with the registration of the competitors.

Entry Requirements for Germany

On 03/07/2004 was the new EU Regulation (Regulation 998/2003 of the European Parliament and the Council of 26.05.2003) on the import and export of pets (dogs, cats, ferrets) between EU Member States and third countries in EU Member States concerned.

The regulation states that pets must be tattooed or marked to clearly identify electronically. The microchip must comply with ISO standard 11784 or 11785. If the chip does not meet these standards, it must be by the keeper a corresponding reading device provided. The marking of tattoo is only a transitional measure until the 2nd Permitted in July 2011.

Be carried on entry into one of the above mentioned countries, the new EU pet passport which is issued by a veterinarian and stating that which a valid rabies vaccination of the animal - possibly a valid booster vaccination against rabies - an inactivated vaccine (WHO standard was made). Special arrangements from third countries must be observed.
